Corvette News from Hotcars.com

Eight brand-new <u>Chevrolet Corvettes</u>, including a possible early version of the high-powered **ZR1**, were stolen last week from the GM assembly plant in Bowling Green, Kentucky. The stolen vehicles have since been recovered, and one suspect is in custody.

The <u>theft</u> happened at the factory lot where completed vehicles are staged before shipment. According to the Warren County Sheriff's Office, the thieves cut through a fence to reach the cars, then drove off with eight <u>Corvettes</u> – some still wearing factory stickers and protective wrapping, according to *Road and Track*.

An officer first noticed something suspicious when he spotted a maroon Corvette parked outside a local apartment complex. It looked brand new and still had factory markings. At the time, there were no reports of stolen vehicles, but when police contacted General Motors, a quick inventory check confirmed the cars were missing.

Authorities <u>reportedly</u> later found several of the Corvettes nearby. A few were recovered at the Laurel Ridge Apartments, one was discovered less than half a mile away, and others turned up about two miles from the plant. Photos of the cars surfaced online, including what appears to be a camouflaged prototype of the upcoming <u>2025 Corvette ZR1</u>.

Police say two suspects tried to leave town with the cars but didn't get far. One of them, 21-year-old Deantae Walker from Westland, Michigan, was arrested after a short pursuit. He now faces charges for receiving stolen property over \$10,000, fleeing police, and resisting arrest.

This is where it gets interesting. Walker and another suspect had reportedly tried to sell a couple of the stolen Corvettes in a Lowe's parking lot. That's where police intercepted them. Photos <u>posted on Facebook</u> show one of the cars loaded onto a flatbed, with a Bowling Green police cruiser in the background. Another one shows a red ZR1.

For Corvette fans, the most eye-catching detail is the possible involvement of a <u>C8 ZR1</u>. While Chevrolet hasn't confirmed if the ZR1 was among the stolen vehicles, the styling and camo in the photos point to a prototype. The Bowling Green plant is the only facility in the world that builds the Corvette. A breach like this is rare – and unsettling. No damage to the vehicles has been reported.
